- Successfully submitting a bid for funding from the Premier League Fans' Fund for Fan Zones and Community Outreach activities.
- Liaising with Councillors, Council Officers, our local MP and the FSA.
- Strengthening the TUST board by recruiting new trustees and improving our governance.
- Increasing membership and improving communication to members.
- Undertaking interviews on TV, radio and local press, etc.
- Facilitating new ownership following Clarke Osborne's decision to put the club into administration.
- Helping to prepare and launch the Community Share Issue.

My time as a board member of TUST has been challenging and at times extremely frustrating, particularly during Osborne's ownership of the club when we were treated with disrespect and contempt by those he put in charge.

However, the TUST board have never wavered in our determination to ensure the club was run properly for the benefit of supporters as well as the wider community.

The fantastic response to the CSI has shown just how much our supporters value our club and how much they want it to succeed in the future.
